Argentina offers vineyards with a captivating setting that fuses magical tradition with extreme altitudes. The highest peaks of the Andes are found in Mendoza: with 22.832 ft, Aconcagua is the highest peak in America. The presence of the Andes, which act as a barrier to the humid winds of the Pacific, added to the distance to the Atlantic Ocean, shape the climate generating ideal conditions for the cultivation of vines.

The altitude, continental climate, heterogeneity of soils and the snowmelt are key factors for the production of excellent wines, which add to a significant winemaking tradition.

Grandiosa from Argentina is made from the country's national grape Malbec. It is a full and food-friendly wine that offers flavors of dark berries, vanilla, fresh herbs, violets and a well-balanced barrel character.

If you want a really juicy piece of beef, grilled burgers, grilled corn cobs or haloumi, Grandiosa matchs the food nicely. Also works well with the chips if you want a glass while you wait for the grill to take off.
