



Grüner Veltliner is the most important autochthonous grape variety in Austria. It became the most widely planted in the 1950s because of the introduction then of Lenz Moser's Hochkultur (High Culture) training system.

Today, the variety is widely planted especially in Niederösterreich and northern Burgenland.

Austria is a cool climate country. The role of the climate is therefore quite significant, which when coupled with the soil structure in the vineyards, and a multitude of other factors, contribute to the regional terroir.

Weinmann Grüner Veltliner is a classic specimen of an original Grüner Veltliner with its clear and refreshed flavors of peach, fresh citrus, white pepper and pears.

A clean and fresh wine such as Weinmann Grüner Veltliner matchs perfectly with classic dishes from the country of origin. Maybe into a juicy authentic Viennese schnitzel made from veal, breaded and fried golden brown served with potatoes?
